Popular instruments are the penny whistle, violin, guitar and bodhrán (a type of drum). This piece starts in a traditional style and gradually becomes more modern. There are fast and slow versions to play along with on the CD. In this type of music the melody parts are played in unison, so the lead instruments have been left on the recording.
